SEEKING GOD

Prayer: Psalm 27:4,8; Psalm 105:1-4
... God is a rewarder of those who earnestly seek Him.
Hebrews 11:6b

The Scriptures are clear that God desires his people to know and enjoy Him. God wants His children to know the blessing of seeking His face along with the intimacy and favor that comes with it: “Seek the Lord and His strength; seek His face always!” (1 Chronicles 16:11; Psalm 105:4). We need His face to shine upon, bless, and envelop us – because all that we are and all that we do in obedience to His commands and commission is the overflow of intimacy and the fruit of His blessing. Here is the good news: The invitation to seek His face is offered to you, right now. The divine initiative of Psalm 27:8 says, “When you said, ‘Seek my face’, my heart said to You, ‘Your face, Lord, I will seek.’” He is saying to us, “Seek My face.” Now we must hear the call – and answer.
